There is one damning fact which proves by itself that the German nature is what it was one year or four years ago, that behind the revolutionary camouflage the same ideas as of old still control German policy. That fact is the persistence of German propaganda.

Its success has been evinced by the recent riots in Egypt due wholly to Teutonic instigation, and systematic effort to stir up strife in India, France, in this country (England) and elsewhere. That wonderful demagogue, Marshal von Hindenburg, at the commands the German armies, and we know that the sinister figure

Ludendorff lurks in the background. The real truth is that the military party have never been shattered, and have never relinquished command of the situation." They have permitted a revolutionary movement a certain play, but whenever they have chosen to curb it they have done so successfully, and there is no doubt that

when it suits their purpose Germany will again be an orderly country and the processes interrupted by the Allied victories will be resumed.

The assertion that the German people were not heart and soul with the war when it started, and when their arms were prospering, is disproved by the conduct of the German

people, by the statements in the newspapers, by the savage addresses delivered in their pulpits, by the absence of the slightest protest even by the socialists who profess to be against all war before the war began, and by the conspicuous absence of any condemnation of the frightfulness with which the war was

waged. The German people were enthusiastic for the war, which they believed would lead them to world supremacy, as the people of Allied countries were for the defence of their hearths and homes, and the freedom of their national life. Justice can draw no line of distinction between the guilt of the German

people as a nation and the guilt of the military party headed by the Kaiser in his shining armour. And if they are guilty, is it not right that they should be punished—is not wise that conditions should be imposed that will prevent them relighting the fires of war, and getting to Paris in 1925? This Brisbane pro-

to fight against the treaty, asser-
ting that if Germany had known what the
terms would be she would have
fought on until the bitter end. They
may be so, and the world is begin-
ning to see that it was a thousand
pities that the war was not pressed
to an absolute military conclusion.
The Germans would have realized

"Inquirer." lured not less than 37 per dozen for less than a month, while on several occasions during the period 1934-1935 have been paid, and on one occasion \$250 was paid in the Brisbane market.

The N.S.W. Board of Australian (N.S.W. branch) is doing splendid work in organising the poultry industry in N.S.W. Its sub-branch at Eastwood had the services of Mr. J. Hamilton, N.S.W. the right direction, and has been promoted by the action of certain good association authorities, who have displayed a want of knowledge of the value of dogs and poultry as live industries in the country. The part that such an association as proposed will have to play will be very important. The first essential, after the association has been formed, is to qualify each and all of them by a thorough all-round test under strict and definite conditions. It will be the duty of any industrial association of an association judge will be bound by faith and confidence in the results of the test. Any variation should not be long in forming, for there is ample scope and work for it. The immense good should accrue as a result.

Cinerarias are coming along nicely, and will require moving into larger quarters as the roots fill the pot. Do not move from a small pot into a large one until the roots are well established. They are moved into a six, one, and from a six to an eight, with a final move into a larger size. The plants are now in the third stage cinerarias should not be given a rich potting compost. Coarse foliage is better than fine foliage. They need good friable loam, one-part leaf mould, some sharp sand, and a sprinkling of bonemeal. When the plants are in the fourth stage, when a small quantity of rotted cow manure can be added. When the plants show signs of forming buds, they should be watered with a weak solution of the first bloomers open. The soil should be moist, but not wet, as cinerarias are not water loving plants, and should quickly show signs of disease under such conditions.

and now is the time to put in young plants. As a garden flower geraniums are very easy of cultivation, and provide a wealth of color. Useful for the garden, they require no special growing situations, for geraniums do not thrive in shade. The soil should be open, friable, and deep, light in texture like a sandy loam, and should be well watered. Little deep watering would be required about six inches above the level of the ground so that the surface moisture can drain quickly away. The ground must be well drained, as the plants will develop rot if the soil is at all over watered. An open soil is necessary because it permits the surplus moisture to drain quickly. Heavy clay land holds moisture and will require the addition of a quantity of sand. Whether planted in the open or in a pot, geraniums will flower for a long time on the same soil. Do not overwater.
